

Registration and Payment

General Registration Information: Parents may register students for classes by mail or in person. Online registration is available for High School Courses only starting February 18, 2015. Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. Completed forms and payment by checks may be dropped off in the Admissions Office in Transfiguration Hall Room 108 during business hours. Phone registrations will not be accepted. Please ensure that information on the registration form is complete - including parent or guardian signatures. All students entering grades K - 8 must have a Summer Programs Pick-Up Authorization Form submitted with their registration.

Registration for The St. Andrew's Schools' students and their siblings begins February 13, 2015. Online registration is available for High School Courses only starting February 18, 2015. Open registration begins March 2, 2015.

Tuition and Fees: Tuition payment in full must accompany the registration form. Cash or checks made out to **Queen Emma Center** will be accepted. Tuition is listed within each of the course descriptions.

Late Registration Fee: A \$25.00 fee will be assessed to any summer program registration received after the below stated deadlines.

Confirmation: Confirmation letters will be sent by May 8 to all students registered by April 29. The Summer Programs Office will notify parents if their registrations are unable to be accommodated.

Course Changes: Each change requested after the registration form has been received will be assessed a \$25.00 fee. Once a session has begun, no refunds will be granted. Students may add a course once the summer has begun without penalty or additional fees.



Policies and Procedures

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is very important for students to benefit from the summer programs. Please call the *Experience Summer!* Office (532-2464) by 8:00 AM if your child will be late or absent.

<u>High School Courses:</u> Credit offered for summer courses are equivalent to a semester or full-year course. Attendance is very important in order for students to benefit from all content and participation. Parents are encouraged to schedule vacations, camps, etc., around the academic summer school dates. Excused absences are only allowed for illness and family emergency. However, students may incur no more than two absences, excused or unexcused, and no more than five tardies to earn credit. Students need to present a note to the *Experience Summer!* Office prior to expected absences.

Students enrolled in *Experience Summer!* are not allowed to leave campus until the completion of their classes.

ILLNESS AT SCHOOL

The St. Andrew's Schools employs a health aide and others trained in first aid for the summer session. If a student becomes ill while at school between the hours of 7:00 AM and 12:00 PM, the health aide will contact parents or the emergency contact listed on the registration form. After 12:00 PM, the Summer Sizzler Director will notify parents. Once a parent is notified, the student must be picked up from school within a reasonable time period. Medication is not dispensed during the summer session.

In the case of an emergency, an adult employee of The St. Andrew's Schools shall accompany the student to the nearest source of emergency care and will stay with the student until a parent or emergency contact arrives.

DROP-OFF/ PICK-UP

Parents of Lower School students may walk students onto campus or drop them off in front of Kennedy Hall by the Coral Cross. Lower and Middle School students enrolled for the morning only must be picked up at 12:00 PM at the crosswalk in front of Kennedy Hall. Any students not picked up by 12:00 PM will be enrolled in the Summer Sizzler Program for the day at \$45.00 per day. Students enrolled in afternoon enrichment programs will be escorted to those programs after lunch. Parents must sign out these students from the Summer Sizzler Program. Students picked up after 5:30 PM on the Experience Summer! Office clock will be assessed a late fee of \$1.00 per minute to be paid immediately to the supervisor in charge. Parents who wish to pick up students prior to 5:30 PM must enter campus and sign out their child with the group leader.

VISITORS TO CAMPUS

Parents and other visitors to campus between 8:00 AM and 5:30 PM must report to the *Experience Summer!* Office (K-107) to obtain a Visitor's Pass. Students wishing to bring a visitor to class must have the written permission of the Director prior to bringing the visitor onto campus.

CELL PHONES

Cell phones brought onto campus by students must be turned off between the hours of 7:45 AM to 12:15 PM. If a student needs to contact parents, the *Experience Summer!* Office will make the necessary communication. If a parent needs to contact or leave a message for a student, a phone call should be made to the *Experience Summer!* Office (532-2464) and the message will be delivered to the student.

INTERNET ACCESS

Only students whose courses require them to have Internet access will be given access for the summer. Students must register their computer with the Technology Department. Students and parents must sign the Acceptable Use Policy (AUP.)

BOOKS AND MATERIALS

<u>Lower and Middle School Programs</u>: Students should come to school prepared with basic school materials labeled with their name: paper, pencils, crayons, markers, etc. The St. Andrew's Schools will provide books and craft materials.

<u>High School Courses:</u> St. Andrew's will provide many of the materials. Textbooks may be purchased through online vendors. This information will be available after registration confirmation online at http://standrewsschools.org/summerprograms.

REPORT CARDS

Summer School report cards will be issued for credit courses only. Mid-summer interim progress reports will be sent home with the student and must be signed and returned by the parent/guardian. Final report cards will be mailed home upon completion of coursework. Students wishing to have their grades sent to other schools should contact the *Experience Summer!* Office for a Report Transfer Request Form. Report cards will be mailed directly from the Registrar's Office.

FINAL EXAMS

Final exams may be administered for credit classes at the discretion of the teacher and approval of the Director. The final exam will count for no more than 20% of the final grade in the course. Students with an unexcused absence for the final exam will receive "0" points for the exam. Students will not be allowed to take an exam early without the permission of the Director.

DRESS CODE

Attire and appearance appropriate to the school setting is expected. Examples of inappropriate attire include, but are not limited to, tube tops, bare midriffs, very short skirts, short shorts (shorts and skirts should be no shorter than finger-tip length), swimwear, and tattered/torn clothing. No visible undergarments are allowed. Shoes, sandals, or slippers must be worn at all times. Hair and make up should be natural in style and color to the student. The St. Andrew's Schools does not permit clothing that is provocative, obscene, or displays advertisements for, or suggested use of tobacco, alcohol, illegal substances, sex or violence. The display of symbols that encourage divisiveness based on race, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, or other protected status is also forbidden.

BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS

Students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner conducive to the learning environment. Positive behavior choices add to the fun and quality of the experience. Behavior that disrupts the learning process or the rights of others to learn is not acceptable. Some of those behaviors include the following:

- Academic dishonesty such as cheating or plagiarism
- Assault/ fighting
- Disrespect of the human or property rights of others
- Theft/vandalism
- Disrespect toward an adult or student
- Being off-campus during class time without permission from the school
- Promotion, possession, or use of alcohol, tobacco or drugs, either illegal or legal with abuse
- Violation of Acceptable Use Policy

REQUIREMENTS FOR NON-HAWAI'I RESIDENTS (MAINLAND U.S. & INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS)

<u>Health Requirements</u>: Students who are not Hawai'i residents (this includes international as well as U.S. Mainland residents) and Hawai'i residents who are not currently residing in Hawai'i, must submit a physical examination and tuberculosis clearance performed within 12 months by a U.S. licensed physician prior to the starting date of *Experience Summer!*

<u>Local Address and Phone Number</u>: All non-Hawai'i residents are <u>required</u> to list a local address and a local telephone number on their registration form.

Summer Sports and Swim

For students entering grades 1-6 1:00 PM-5:30 PM

Time to move! Students will rotate daily through two different sports clinics per session that emphasize the development of a love for sports, building up of sports skills, and learning of fundamentals through game play. Our certified coaches also help our students cultivate good sportsmanship, develop a growth mindset, and promote an active and healthy lifestyle. Along with sports, swim lessons will be offered with qualified WSI-certified instructors at the YWCA. Students progress through required levels established by the American Red Cross. Students will enjoy field trips that incorporate different aspects of fitness once a week. Algebra I Prep (no credit)

10:15 AM-12:15 PM

In this course, students will review the basic skills of Pre-Algebra. Topics include fractions, negative numbers, proportions, linear equations, inequalities, exponents, functions, and graphs. Application of algebra skills is emphasized.

For students entering Grade 8 - 9

Algebra II Prep (no credit)

8:00 AM - 10:00 AM

In this course, students will <u>review the basic skills of algebra</u>. Topics include proportions, variations, linear equations, systems of equations, inequalities, exponents and exponential equations, functions, transformations of graphs, and quadratic functions. Application of algebra skills is emphasized. (*Requirement: TI-84 or 84-plus graphing calculator; Prerequisite: Algebra I and Geometry*)

AP Calculus and Calculus Prep (no credit)

This course is designed to prepare students for taking AP Calculus or Calculus 1. Students will gain a refresher on the fundamental topics needed to succeed in Calculus that were covered in Pre-Calculus and Algebra II. (*Prerequisite: Pre-Calculus*)

Circuit Training, Aerobics & Hiking (1/2 credit)

10:15 AM-12:15 PM

This course offers three sports in one class. Circuit training is designed for beginners who want to tone their muscles and increase their cardiovascular systems, receiving proper instruction. Aerobics is designed for the beginner in mind. Students will learn different aerobic steps and skills that will allow them to complete different exercise videos and develop their own aerobic exercise routines. 
