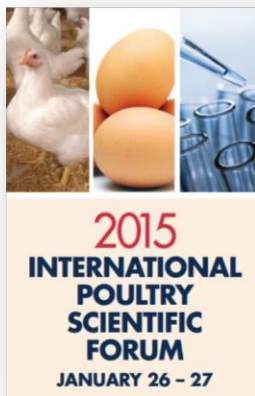

Five of the graduate students involved in research presented in Atlanta received IPSF \$500 Travel Awards from Diamond V, presented later at our IPPE booth (photos below).

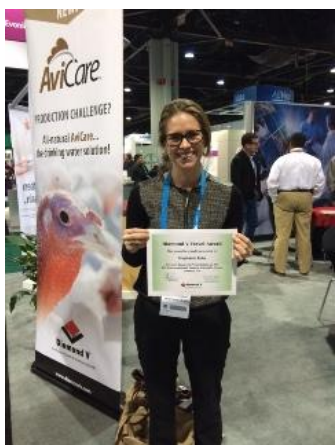
