

Refresher: Certified Lead Paint Renovator (RRP)

Renovator certification expiration date

Renovator certification is typically for 5 years from the date of course completion. However, in 2009, EPA extended the 5-year certification of renovators who took an EPA accredited renovator training before April 22, 2010 until July 1, 2015. The extension ensured that renovators who received training early, before the regulations work practice standards were effective, weren't penalized for doing so.

Renovators seeking re-certification who complete a 4-hour refresher training before the expiration of their current certification are certified for a period of five years from the date they complete the refresher course, not from the date of expiration of their previous certification. Renovators will have to take the 8-hour course if they fail to take the refresher training before the expiration of their current certificate. Don't wait !!! Get Re-Certified BEFORE the Deadline.

Eligibility for refresher training

A certified renovator is eligible to take the refresher course if the course is completed before their previous certification expires. The student is responsible for determining if they are eligible to take the refresher course, see your certificate for the expirations date. Trainers are not required to verify a student's eligibility to take the refresher course, but are encouraged to remind students of the eligibility requirements. This is a violation and subject to fines if a student fails to comply

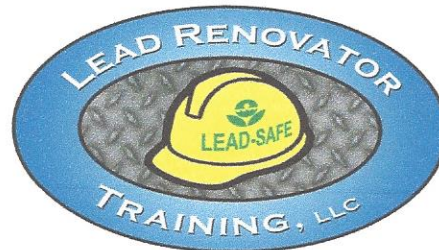

Firm certification

Re-certification. Firm certifications expire every five years. Firms should submit their re-certification application at **least 90 days before their expiration**. This will help ensure their re-certification is complete before they expire. A firm can find their certification number on their certificate, by looking it up online, or by contacting our hotline at 1-800-424-LEAD (5323). When applying for re-certification, firms should select "re-certification" on the application. This way their new certification will begin when their old one expires, rather than when the application processing was complete, so they're not penalized for applying early. **Do you Meet
the EPA
requirements?**

EPA required, by April 22, 2010, for all contractors who work in pre-1978 housing and child occupied facilities, including: renovation contractors, maintenance workers in multi-family housing, painters, building supervisors & landlords, homeowners who are planning to remodel, and other specialty trades (plumbers, heating & cooling, electricians).

In Class:

- Learn proper Lead Testing, Lead Safe setup, work practices, and cleaning renovation jobs
- Learn about the Lead Paint pamphlet that renovators are required to hand out
- Includes all books, hand outs & paperwork for applying for your EPA certification

The Certified Lead Renovator:

- must be present at each work site for Target Housing (pre-1978) or Child Occupied Facilities (schools & day care)
- must be on-site at each impacted building on a daily basis
- must be at the job-site during paint testing, sign posting, work are set-up and clean-up phases of the work.
- Provide training to the non-certified work staff that will be working on buildings affected by this regulation.
- NOTE: Each contractor performing work that disturbs lead-based paint must have their own Certified Lead Renovator present – not just one per job site.
- All of who will become designated as "EPA Certified Lead Renovators"

Firm certification

Initial Firm Certification. Firm certifications are required for all companies or individuals who wish to bid on or work on Pre-78 housing, they expire every five years. Firms should submit their certification application ASAP and for re-certification at least 90 days before their expiration. This will help ensure compliance & their certification is completed before they expire for recertification's. Initial certification applications can take 3-6 weeks. A firm can find their certification number on their certificate, by looking it up online, or by contacting our hotline at 1-800-424-LEAD (5323). When applying for re-certification, firms should select "re-certification" on the application. This way their new certification will begin when their old certification expires, rather than when the application processing was complete, so they're not penalized for applying early.
