Dr. Rubina Peroomian (Minassian) was born in Tabriz, and raised in Tehran, Iran, moved to the U.S. in 1978. After receiving her B.S. in Civil Engineering, Tehran University, 1960, received her Diplome d'Etude Française, University of Sorbonne, in 1962, M.A. in Middle Eastern Languages and Cultures (Majoring in Armenian Literature), UCLA, 1982, and Ph.D. in Middle Eastern Languages and Cultures (Majoring in Armenian Literature), UCLA, 1989.



Dr. Peroomian, from 1994 to present has been Associate Researcher UCLA Department of Near Eastern Languages and Cultures, 1989 – 1994 Lecturer of Armenian Language and Literature UCLA Department of Near Eastern Languages and Cultures, Spring 1992 Guest Lecturer UCLA Department of History *Taught History 112B, Armenia from the Cilician Kingdom through the Periods of Foreign Domination and National Stirrings – 11th to 19th Centuries*. Lectured as well at University of La Verne, Glendale College and was a lecturer at Armenian Relief Society Summer Studies, Amherst, Massachusetts.

Dr. Peroomian to date published sixteen books and booklets about Armenian Genocide and numerous article in Armenian and non-Armenian periodicals. She received handful of prestigious awards; Lifetime Achievement Award, granted by the Armenian Educational Foundation, annual "Educator of the Year Award," October 10, 1999, Glendale, California. Mesrob Mashtots Medal of Honor with a formal encyclical of His Holiness Aram I Catholicos of the Holy See of Cilicia, a Gold Medal (Voske Hushamedal) by Republic of Armenia Minister of Education, and Armenian National Committee of America – Western Region Life Time Achievement Award .
