INVITATION TO APPLY FOR PROVINCE II GRANTS FOR MINISTRIES WITH YOUTH, YOUNG ADULTS AND HIGHER EDUCATION

Province II of the Episcopal Church invites proposals for grants to support ministries with youth and young adults, including ministries to higher education. A TOTAL of \$25,000 is available for 2015. Previous grants were awarded in the range of \$2,500 to \$7,800 each.

Successful grant proposals might highlight the following:

- focus on Christian formation or mission;
- serve under-resourced populations and under-served mission fields;
- demonstrate innovation in ministry and mission;
- partner with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) or other churches or non-profit organizations;
- make use of peer ministers and other youth or young adult leadership.

Leaders in charge of ministries receiving grants are expected to document how the grant was used through a short video or photo slideshow and a written report – a good news story that can be published by Province II. Leaders of ministries receiving grants may be assigned a mentor as a resource for the duration of the grant period. If so, the mentor will be chosen in consultation with provincial and diocesan leaders where the ministry is located. Grant proposals must include a budget and, if applicable, show how the diocese, parish, or other organizations support the ministry. The bishop of the diocese in which the ministry is located must endorse all proposals via email.

By "youth" we mean young people in grades 6-12. By "young adults" we mean people ages 18-35. Higher education includes community colleges, and public and private universities.

The deadline for submitting an application is <u>March 20, 2015</u>. This includes the approval of the Diocesan Bishop.
