
What an exciting time to be a part of God's Kingdom here at the United Methodist Church of Sun City Center! I am blessed to be your pastor.

Your Parking Team - Road from the Green Lot

Once we began to fill our main parking lot we realized we needed to ask people to park in the Green Lot behind the hospital. At first we had about eight or nine cars. Recently we had as many as 82! This is great but we then realized that we needed to find a quicker and safer way to do the transporting between the Green Lot and the church. So we explored the idea of cutting a cart path between the main lot and the Green Lot. We decided that the best place to do this would be next to the Timely Treasures building...



But as you can see it was a mess. God however took charge and we ended up with many groups participating that eventually helped make this become a reality. Here is what happened:

- The Disaster Response Team (DRT) dug a road bed and cleared out all of the dead brush
- Minto Communities provided over 5 yards of top soil for fill dirt and landscaping
- Earl Gall and Doug Moore loaded about 40 stones from a dumpster in KP and made a stone wall
- Then the DRT contributed over 4 yards of gravel for the road bed
- Ted Kulinna built a rugged ramp for the golf cart to drive over the curb
- Brenda Morrow and Heidi Evans began to research what plants would work best in the shade of the TT building. They have since purchased and planted the plants
- Our church neighbor in the first house North of the church contributed some discarded curbing

We noticed through all of this that there were numerous birds that lived in the area and even a friendly Raccoon. The trip from the Green Lot to our Sanctuary has become a very relaxing and enjoyable drive. There is even a small stream that we drive along. For those cold days, we have blankets ... that were made by church members, to help keep you warm. (And on days when we aren't real busy you may even get your windows washed.)



It is a great experience. You are picked up at your car door, driven by a friendly and cheerful tour guide to the patio of the church, all in a matter of a few minutes, plus you're passing through a beautiful garden on the way.




Coming in April are two thought-provoking bible studies for women:

Through the Eyes of Love



Love...it's what missions are all about. Missions are our way of reaching out to those in need, and our church has a deep capacity for touching the lives of so many, not just here but around the world. I have been aware of one mission that we support as a church but I never fully understood its importance until I recently did some research on it. There is a place dedicated to the love and care of children that we help support, the Florida United Methodist Children's Home. At first, I was under the mistaken impression that this was some kind of orphanage that we help support with a special offering on 5th Sundays a few times a year. But I have to tell you, this organization is so much more than I ever imagined. I'd like to share some of the information I learned in the hope that you will come to better understand this incredible facility as well.

The Children's Home was founded in 1908 by the Methodist Annual Conference in Enterprise, Florida, which is just a little north of Orlando. This is a home and shelter for children ages 5-18 who are unable to live in their natural home for various reasons - abuse, neglect, abandonment. Currently there are over 300 children in the care of their Residential Program, their Foster Care and Child Care Center. The children live in one of fourteen homes, each home providing for 8-10 boys or girls. They live two in a room and are responsible for keeping their rooms clean, doing various chores, homework, and managing day to day life in the cottage. They eat family style and enjoy the comfort of a loving home. Two sets of house parents ensure a stable, secure and home-like atmosphere. The average stay of a child is about 12 to 18 months, but some will remain for much longer depending upon the circumstances.

Of course, these children have so many needs and the Children's Home does everything they can to see that they are met. They attend school, worship services on Sunday and Bible Studies during the week. A Chaplain oversees this comprehensive spiritual program and they even have a Music Coordinator who leads two choirs, offers piano lessons and provides a full music program. There are also professional clinical therapists on staff to help these children cope with the traumatic emotional events they have experienced.

United Methodist Church Brings Hope - Uganda Mission Trip

The Ugandan mission team returned January 29th after a 14-day medical mission trip to the village of Gulu in northern Uganda. Our team served the women of Watoto Living Hope, the orphans and staff at Watoto Laminadera Village, and the families who walked from the surrounding villages. The team was composed of a medical doctor and pharmacist from Seattle, a RN from Sarasota, and two therapists from Sun City Center.

Four hundred and seven people received medical treatment, medications, health education, evaluations for reading glasses, and testing for HIV, malaria, and diabetes. Many prayers and hugs, no less important, were shared.

The team was able to travel to Eastern Uganda to the mountain village of Kapchorwa, and tour the hospital there. The hospital is very underequipped and receives medications for their patients only once every other month. While we were touring we heard the first cry of a baby born at the hospital! We traveled to a nearby village and watched a presentation of "cycle beads", a

form of birth control that was funded by a member of a previous mission team.

When we returned to Kampala, the capital of Uganda, we had the opportunity to host Mamma Martha and the eight kids of the orphanage house in Bbira Village, our church sponsors, to a luncheon at a local restaurant. What a joy to see them once again and watch the youngest kids experience their first taste of ice cream!

The team would like to thank the Mission Team for their support (we were able to fund all the medication given out at the two sites), Pages of Life for the bibles and crosses, Sew-n-Sews and Good Samaritan Mission ladies for the 80 plus dresses given to the women and children of Living Hope, and the congregation for the 130 pairs of reading glasses and prayers of support and encouragement.

View from the Pew-Office

I love my job! Once again, I have had the opportunity to interview one of our amazing staff members, Pat Hill. When I asked Pat to allow me to write about her for this month's Journey, she laughed and said she was such a boring person, I wouldn't have much to write about. Nothing could be further from the truth.

Pat grew up in Toronto, Canada. She was active in her church where her parents led the youth group. Pat taught a Sunday School class at the age of 13 and she sang in the Junior Choir. When she was 18, her dad's job moved her parents to Georgia but Pat stayed behind to attend college in Montreal. There she earned a degree in business and soon landed her first "dream job" as the assistant to the heir of the Seagram's family corporation. She describes her workplace as the most opulent, glamorous, luxurious office suite you could possibly imagine. But Pat decided that she wanted to see more of

the world than just the view from the 18th floor of the Seagram's building, so at the age of 25 she took off to go backpacking across Europe. She had saved enough money to buy a used VW, carried a pup tent, cooked over an open fire, and covered at least 8 countries in about 6 months. It was an awesome experience but she decided it was time to come back home to Toronto. There she got a job in public relations for a large advertising agency...her second "dream job". This is when she met her husband, Les, who worked for another advertising firm in Toronto. Pat left her advertising job and began a new career teaching business and English in a private college. During this time,

she had her two children, Ashley and Cameron.

Now you're probably asking yourself, how in the world did Pat end up in Florida? That was my next question. Les was transferred to Boca Raton, Florida in 1980 and here's where things got really interesting. Since both Les and Pat had experience with advertising, they decided to open their own agency. This soon became a highly lucrative business when they acquired a 13 million dollar account with Nutrisystem. This was a time in Pat's life

that she recalls with mixed emotions. She told me, "We had it all...the big house, a boat, a housekeeper, I traveled all over the world. BUT, I lost sight of God and suddenly, we lost it all." It happened when the US entered the Gulf War which had a profound effect on the Nutrisystem business. They were losing money and Pat and Les could no longer afford to maintain the five offices they had built across the country. Before they had to declare bankruptcy, they let the business go and Pat went to work for a non-profit organization called Food for the Poor. She relates that this was a very scary time for her as she had lost her house, all the material things that had become a big part of her life. She feared "they might end up living under a bridge." But God had different plans for the Hill's. They started attending a Methodist Church in Boca Raton and one Sunday, she was sitting there and heard God speak to her just as clear as a bell. It was one of those "God moments" that Pastor Charlie talks about. She said that God told her to go to the front of the church and get down on her knees

> and He said to her, "Pat, trust me. Don't you know I will never let anything happen to you and your family?" And do you know who the pastor of that church was? None other than Warren Langer. Warren hired Pat as the Christian Education Director and she loved her new life. I guess this was her next "dream job". Over the course of the next 15 years, Pat served with Warren in churches in Jacksonville and Orlando. She said, "Every time he moved, he would call and say 'We have an opening' and I would move." She laughed and said, "We used to joke about who's stalking who!"

Of course, when Warren was our pastor, he quickly found a spot for Pat on his staff as the Director of

Ministries. She has served in that capacity for almost 5 years. She has done so much to improve our church and has been instrumental in developing many of our new ministries. Pat just smiles and says, "I am so blessed to be here. I've worked in a lot of churches but this one is by far the best. We have such incredible pastors and our volunteers keep us going. I've thought about moving but Les and I ask each other how we could possibly leave this church and all our friends here. **This** is where God wants me to be!" Hopefully, her last "dream job".



1. Disaster Response Team

Scrap metal recycling helps fund UMCSCC's Disaster Response Team. To donate your aluminum cans, place them in the trailer near the back of the parking lot. 2. Timely Treasures Team

- d. We will deliver furniture purchased from our Timely Treasures sale to its new destination in Sun City Center for a Delivery Charge of \$25.

3. Scrip Cards/Gift Cards Program

The Scrip Card/Gift Card Program helps fund UMCSCC Missions programs. We offer more than 600 cards that you can use at restaurants, grocery stores, department stores, filling stations, and many other businesses. The ever-increasing problems with credit card fraud makes shopping with Scrip Cards much safer and just as easy. You can place your order on Sunday and pay by using cash, check, credit card or debit card. Your cards will be ready for you to pick up the following Sunday. Publix and Winn Dixie shopping cards are always in stock for your immediate purchase. All cards purchased will list the percentage of that card's value that will be donated to the UMCSCC Mission Team fund. The card is not devalued because of the amount given to our mission programs.

4. Dining to Donate Program

Dining at specific local restaurants also benefits UMCSCC Missions teams. A Dining to Donate display board in the LEC explains the process. Some restaurants, at check out, require you to submit a flyer (available on the board); other restaurants require that you give UMC a copy of your receipt (these may be placed in the designated Receipt Pocket on the board) for us to turn in to them before we receive the benefit.

A golf tournament will be held on April 11th at Freedom Fairways to help raise funds for the India Mission project. Partnering with Hearts Afire, a mission team is being formed to travel to India in January 2016 to provide healing, prayer, teaching, and dedication of a church to be built in 2015. Hearts Afire is a medically-oriented mission organization based in Sarasota that was founded by two local physicians. The team will be based in Andresh Pradesh region of India with plans to travel to three villages there.

India is a large country with a population of 1.22 billion people, many living in poverty, but hungry for food and the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

According to Dr. Vilma Vega MD, who will be leading the team, "During our trip in early April of this year (2014) we medically treated more than 800 patients and we saw more than 600 people accept Christ. In the last few days of our mission, we saw 125 pastors receive a message of Revival through Unity in the body of Christ, and boy was it received. I am here to tell you that the India Revival is here and growing. Here we were in April 2014 and not only had the church tripled since 2009 but there is now a Christian church every few blocks. While driving to our second clinic, I even got the privilege of watching a Christian crusade in the streets with all the participants marching with large crosses in hand."


