WHAT

April is National Poetry Month! Students are invited to celebrate by entering American Martyrs' **First Annual Haiku contest!** The theme is "Celebrating our Community."

Winning entries will be selected throughout April, and everyone who enters is invited to participate in a special poetry "Open Mic Night" at Pages bookstore in downtown Manhattan Beach.

HOW

Write a haiku, which is an ancient Japanese poetic form written in a just a few words. It is 17 syllables long - divided into three lines of five, seven and five syllables.

Your haiku can be about anything having to do with our Manhattan Beach community – your school, your library, your friends, your church, your town. Be Creative; Have fun!

WHEN

The submission deadline is Friday, March 27th at **3pm.** Entries will be evaluated by a special AMS Poetry Panel and winning haikus will be showcased by AMS.

"Open Mic night" will be at 6pm on Thursday, April 30th - which is also national "poem in your pocket" day. This is a real day designated for kids AND adults around the country which is celebrated by selecting a pocket-size poem, carrying it with them & sharing it with others throughout the day. You can hand out your own poem, or you can download ones selected from poets.org.
