There are also tentative plans for a more "hands on" participation with this Organization starting sometime this year.

Another new project in the works for early 2016 is one that Sue Justis is organizing. We are hoping to start a monthly Bingo outing complete with a light lunch for the elderly living in nearby HUD apartments. We are excited about this new outreach program and hope many of you will join us.


