When we think of June, we probably think of two events in most of our lives. One is graduation and the other is weddings. These are large life moments in most of our lives. They are moments of death and resurrection. In graduation we are dying to our childhood and rising to our adult life, and in marriage we are dying to our single life and rising to a new life of a couple.

In graduation whether it is from high school or college, we get a piece of paper that says that we have fulfilled the requirements for specific degree. Our parents are there and our friends are there and there are lots of hugs, tears, well wishes and parties, but graduation is only the beginning. The question becomes, "What do I do with that piece of paper?" In other words, "What do I do with the rest of my life?" Unfortunately many young people are so relieved to graduate they forget about the larger picture. The big questions cannot really be answered in a few days or even in a few months, but we do need to ask them from time to time to make sure we are on the path that is right for us.

Another big life moment is a wedding. A tremendous industry has grown up around the words, "I do". When we get married we also get a piece of paper from the state, a certificate of marriage, stating where and when and by whom we were married. Again we have parents and friends, lots of hugs and kisses and good wishes and a large reception. People go into a great amount of debt to tie the knot, but again the question arises, "What about the marriage?" or "will these two people through their love for each other, make the world a better place?" I'm often reminded of one of those black and white "God" billboards that said, "The wedding was wonderful, invite me to the marriage" signed God.

This June 19th, our Bishop is coming for confirmation. It is also one of those moments when people recommit to the faith publicly. It is one of the great days of our spiritual lives. Please join us that day to welcome who are being confirmed. I know it is Father's Day, but why not start the day off right and bring Dad to church.

We remember June because of the life moments that occur. Those moments that helps to shape and determine our lives, but they are simply moments. The real question is what are we going to do with those pieces of paper that we have stuffed in the drawer or are hanging on the wall. What do we do with those June moments in our lives to fulfill moments and our lives with joy, with God and with each other?

Check out the garden by Hidden Treasures Academy its growing!!!


