Dear Parish Family,

The leaves on the trees are starting to change which means that fall is upon us and that means it is time for Stewardship. Most people think that the word stewardship was thought up by some church official to mask the fact that the church is asking for money. But stewardship is actually a very old word; we even see it in the Bible. A steward was a manger of a property that was owned by someone else. In one sense Adam and Eve were stewards of the garden, and that didn't work out to well. Jesus also used the image of stewards in many of his parables.

When we really think about it, we are stewards of everything that God has given us. There are many people who think on one level or another, "I worked hard for my money and it's mine." Those people forget that God has given them the time and their health so that they could work and make the money. Today we give back to God a portion of our time, our talents and our money. Last month we pledged our time and talents during out Rally Day. On November 1st we will be making our monetary pledge to the church for 2016. During October we will be hearing a lot about stewardship and money, not only from the clergy, but also from parishioners telling their stories of their stewardship journeys. October we will be sending out a letter with a pledge card for you to fill out and bring to church on November 1.



One very important matter we all need to consider in our giving for the coming year is that the vestry will be calling a new rector for All Saints' Parish. Your financial pledge for next year will greatly determine the salary that will be offered to prospective candidates. It may also determine the number of candidates we receive. So it is important that you be as generous with your commitment to the parish as possible. We often hear people say, "I'm on a fixed income." When we think about it, everyone whether they are working or retired is on a fixed income. God knows our circumstances and only wishes a portion in return for all He has given us so freely.

Please consider carefully and prayerfully your pledge for the coming year during the coming weeks.



Last school year, 7th grade student Jordan Millern, was invited to participate in the Duke TIP program due to her high TCAP test scores from 6th grade. The TIP program allows young gifted students to take the ACT to determine where their education can be improved upon or rounded out. Jordan took the ACT in February and received a combined score of 25.

There were a total of 64,481 middle school students, from across the nation, that participated in taking the ACT. Of those 64,481 students, 2,230, the top 4%, qualified for the Grand Recognition Ceremony. Jordan was in that top 4%.

All students were celebrated at their State Recognition Ceremony for being able to participate in the Duke TIP program to begin with. The top 4% achievers were invited to attend the Grand Recognition Ceremony to be held on the Duke University Campus. Jordan was fortunate to be asked to attend. There were 500 students that were able to attend. Some of the students came from as far away as Hawaii and Alaska to be celebrated, at Duke University, for all their hard work.
