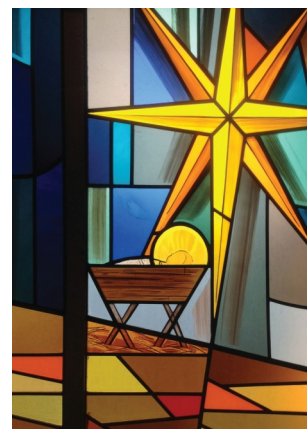

The ECW will support CEASE for their Christmas project. Bring a nice gift for a woman to the Christmas party to be donated, and don't wrap it.

The money is here for the Hidden Treasures plant beds, and they will be installed shortly.

By the time you read this, the Thanksgiving foods collected will have been delivered to Central Services. Thank you for your generous contributions. After this special drive, we will continue our on-going support for this agency so please continue to bring a can or two of food. The basket carried to the altar each Sunday will remain in the Narthex for your gifts.

After Thanksgiving, a box will be put in the Narthex for pajamas for Food on Foot. All pajamas must be brought to the church by Wednesday, December 16<sup>th</sup> so I can deliver them in time for the distribution on Saturday, December 19, the day the children will pick up their last food bag before Christmas. Carolyn, at Food on Foot, says one of their biggest requests is for sleep pants in Men's sizes Small, Medium and Large. There is also a need for both boys' and girls' pajamas in sizes 8 -10 and 14 -16 as well as pajamas for girls who wear Ladies' sizes Small, Medium and Large. This has always seemed to be a popular Outreach asking. It fulfills a real need while being something easy to obtain and relatively inexpensive.

We will continue to fill food bags for Food on Foot usually on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month. Your contributions are vital to this program. If you wish to write a check, please designate it for Food on Foot.

As their Christmas outreach project this year, the ECW will be asking members to bring a gift for a woman who is in shelter at CEASE. Toys for Tots and other Organizations provide for the children, but the women are often left out. Suggestions for these gifts are a nice, inexpensive piece of jewelry, pretty lotions, nice gloves, manicure items like nail polish and remover, etc. or pretty bedroom slippers or a small bottle of perfume. These gifts do not need to be wrapped as they will be on display in a special room so the children can select gifts for their mothers. Any excess gifts will be saved for upcoming birthdays of shelter residents. We think this will be a fun thing for our members to do and will certainly help make holidays brighter for those in shelter.

We will also be having a short Advent drive for funds to support Lynne Ann's daughter and her husband on their mission to Mongolia. A short, informative request will be made at both services for two Sundays early in Advent. I know some members are already supporting this young couple, but this will give others a chance to contribute to this very worthy cause.

Lend a Hand will be helping construct the garden beds for Hidden Treasures since that group has raised the money necessary to buy supplies. Lend a Hand has completed other small jobs, and if you know of a need, please let Larry McGowan or me know.

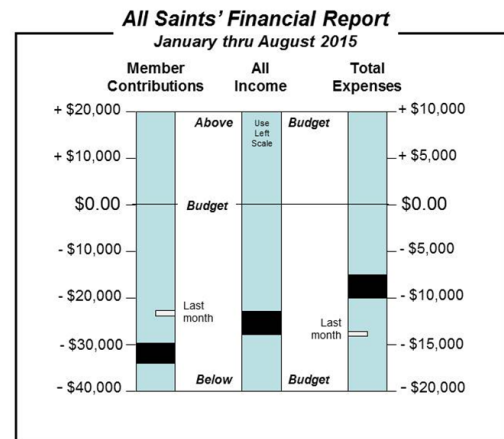


## Building & Grounds

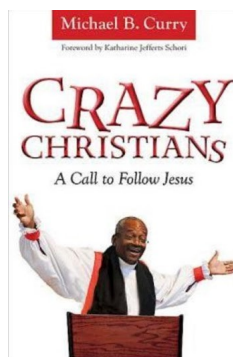

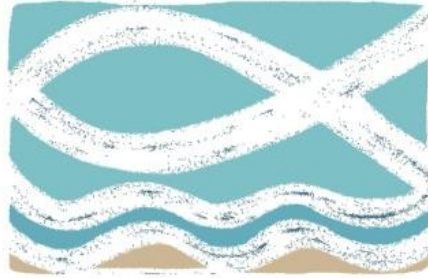

# EVANGELISM



We have been reaching out to the large Hispanic/Latino community in Morristown in several ways.

**First:** Through the periodic gatherings and discussions of Project Canterbury, which is about 50% Hispanic young adults, Henry and Cindy Selby have listened and offered guidance. One of the issues that concerns these young men and women, most of whom are lawfully present through Deferred Action Childhood Arrivals (DACA), working full time and attending college, is that of Tuition Equality, allowing DACA students to pay in-state tuition at state colleges. (The difference between in-state out-of-state tuition is substantial, e.g. ETSU: \$7,543 vs \$23,623; MTSU: \$7,840 vs \$24,070). A recent bill addressing this issue passed in the TN Senate 21-12. When it came before the TN House of Representatives, the vote was 49-47, but failed by ONE VOTE because it needed 50 votes to pass. The Tuition Equality bill comes back before the House in March of 2016. The Project Canterbury students have been actively raising public awareness of their plight, attending meetings with the Tennessee Immigrant & Refugee Coalition folks in Knoxville, and contacting Representatives.

**Second:** All Saints' is a member of HOLA Lakeway (Hispanic Outreach Leadership Association) represented by Henry and Cindy Selby at their monthly meetings. This organization, headed by attorney Willie Santana, has the mission of facilitating the integration of the Hispanic/Latino families of the Lakeway area into the community, through a language exchange (local ESL and Spanish classes), celebration of Latino culture in an annual food festival, and increasing positive media coverage of Hispanics in the community. All Saints' is providing meeting space for HOLA Lakeway on December 14 at 6PM. If you would like to help me prepare the parish hall to be especially welcoming (think tablecloths, flowers), please contact me.

And keep Wednesday, December 2, open on you calendar for a possible special speaker explaining Tuition Equality.

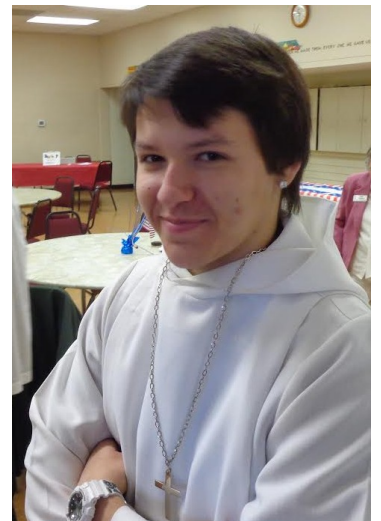

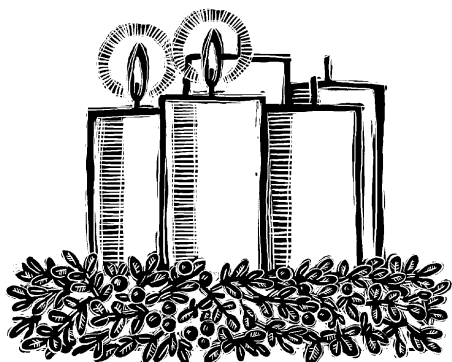

In this country it has become popular over the last 50 years.

This year at All Saints' we are going to try a variation of last year's service where we have an abbreviated lessons and carols at the beginning of the service followed by the Eucharist. This will allow us to enjoy this service without adding to already busy time of year for everyone. Our service of Advent Lessons and Carols will be on December 6 at 10:30 am.
