Currently, Fulton County Schools offers some degree of choice to families including magnet programs, charter schools, open enrollment where space is available, and family and employee hardship considerations.



During the 2014 – 2015 school year, Fulton County Schools is exploring strategic expansion of education choice options to improve student achievement by offering more selection to meet student needs equitably across the district, while utilizing facilities and resources efficiently. The District does not intend to remove attendance boundaries, or make changes to employee hardship policies as part of choice option expansion.

Fulton County Schools believes in locally grown educational solutions tailored to each community's specific needs, and in early 2015 will be gathering family input to inform the expansion of District choice options. 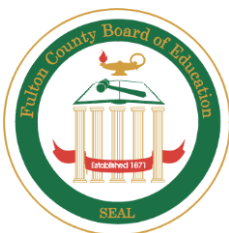
