

## **Calling All Mentors of Young Artists: Enter Your Budding Mentee in the *My StickerCalendar Art Call***

**Attention of mentors/parents/relatives of kids 12 years and younger!** We need your child's art for the annual [My Sticker Calendar!](#) The award-winning bilingual calendar, which was first published in 2006, helps everyone track and plan time spent across households. So far, the Office of the Attorney General has distributed more than 380,000 calendars to Texas families, and it is time to create a calendar for 2016.

Have the child draw a favorite activity with a parent or something that represents the holidays for the month or change of seasons —such as winter, spring, major holiday or a lazy summer day. Suggestions for stickers include: Veterans Day; birthdays; chores and school events. For more ideas and specifications for submitting art, refer to the requirements. It has a great list of do's and don'ts. Increase the child's chances for selection by picking a Texas holiday, lesser known holiday, or a special chore your child enjoys doing with an adult or friend.

Hurry and submit your little artist's masterpiece because the deadline is **Wednesday, April 1** — no fooling! Print the [template](#) and ask the child to draw within the rectangle. There is no limit on the number of drawings per artist.
