Room at the Inn Transitions Sunday

Shelter Is Moving After Four Weeks at Broadway

There are many stories to tell about Room at the Inn during its stay at Broadway. There are also lots of numbers. Over 430 hours of operation, supported by 20 volunteers and staff each night the doors were open. Gallons of coffee poured. Hundreds of servings of food, donated by Broadway members, and sometimes, from people who read about it in the paper. Fifty cots available each night, and for the past three weeks, almost all occupied. And lastly, Broadway's generous support for Room at the Inn on Christmas Eve.

Our youngest guest was 19 (or at least that's what he said). Our oldest guest was in his 70's. Volunteers and guests watched movies every evening. Several guests brought in a laptop and spent their time in the shelter working on projects, applying for jobs or playing Candy Crush. Several guests made beautiful drawings for volunteers and staff.

Room at the Inn will move from Broadway to Missouri United Methodist Church on Sunday afternoon. The cots will be cleaned, packed up and loaded. The linens will be laundered. Extra supplies and food will be boxed and sent to MUMC for use there. And on Monday, Jay will do the final deep clean on the CLC, and

Broadway's gym will be filled with the sounds of

youth on Wednesday night and children on Sunday morning.

But the mission of Room at the Inn will continue until the morning of March 11, when the doors will close for this winter's season at First Baptist Church. Volunteers will still be needed, particularly at First **Baptist and Fairview Methodist** church, who will be hosting the shelter for the first time. Our experiences here at Broadway will be put to good use helping these congregations staff and manage Room at the Inn in their facilities. The RATI SignUpGenius site will give you the most up-to-date volunteer needs

Thank you, Broadway, for making our space available for Room at the Inn during one of our church's busiest times of the year. It was



noticed by many volunteers and guests—how willing we were to open our doors. The special holiday meals provided by Broadway members and other congregational partners were noticed. The small gifts that were given to guests who spent Christmas with us were appreciated, and such a surprise for them. Thank you to the CWF group and to our Pathways' kids for those very special offerings.

The Broadway Spirit is alive and well. Thank you for sharing that Spirit with our Room at the Inn guests. They noticed.

Becoming An Open and Affirming Church Information Session Is Sunday, January 11

One of the reasons that new Broadway members made the decision to come back for that second visit is always "everyone was so friendly." So, Broadway must already be a friendly and welcoming church, right?

The short answer is: Yes, we are. Broadway is a friendly place to be on Sunday morning—and we all know that because we have already stepped inside and experienced it for ourselves. But for some, the search for a church home comes with the expectation of rejection and disappointment.

For same-sex couples, or individuals who are gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgender, "church" may come with negative connotations, based on real-life experiences of disapproval and judgment. Many Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) churches have made the commitment to become "open and affirming" congregations, taking intentional steps to let those in the LGBT community know, in advance, that they will be welcomed and valued.

This Sunday, January 11, at 10:10 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall, Broadway will begin the discussion on how our church can become "open and affirming." Ellen Flottman will facilitate the conversation.

The GLAD Alliance is a ministry of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Its mission: .to build a Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) that welcomes persons of all



gender expressions and sexual orientations to the table of Christ's communion and to the full life and leadership of the Christian Church.

In Missouri, two Disciples congregations are recognized as open and affirming—only two. These churches have followed the process set forth by the Disciples' GLAD Alliance Ministry to develop church policies that reflect GLAD's mission: to inform the congregation and develop a consensus to support this ministry; and to support the mission of GLAD. After completing this careful and deliberative process, a public statement of support is made to the congregation's Regional Ministry and then to the General Assembly.

All persons, regardless of their sexual orientation, should be able to experience the love of Christ in a community of believers. By becoming an open and affirming congregation, Broadway will extend an intentional invitation to those in the LGBT community to become a part of the life of our church. God's love is for everyone, regardless of who we love. Join the conversation this Sunday.

El Salvador Mission Set for March 21-28

Broadway's partnership with Enlace el Salvador is entering its fourth year. During that time, several groups of Broadway members have made the trek to El Salvador, witnessing the good work being accomplished, contributing to that work and building a bridge

between the people of El Salvador and the people of our congregation.

In 2015, Broadway will offer another opportunity for our members to serve in El Salvador. The trip is scheduled for March 21-28, which also happens to be spring break for local colleges and schools.

The team's work will be determined at a later date, but one of the unique aspects of Enlace el Salvador is their commitment to local input and ownership of



mission projects. The communities served by Enlace will help identify the team's priority project, because they will have already done much of the groundwork and preparation to move that project forward to completion. The local congregational and community "buy-in" for proposed projects has meant a high degree of long-term success and sustainability for churches working with Enlace.

Service Ministry hopes to mitigate the cost of this

international trip with funds raised through its
Wednesday night youth dinner fundraiser. Each
Wednesday, Service Ministry volunteers prepare and serve a meal for Broadway youth and a fellowship meal for adults participating in choir, bells, Bible study (or anyone who enjoys a home-cooked

meal). Proceeds from the meals funded the 2014 trip to Moore, Oklahoma, and it is hoped will provide funding for "in country" lodging and food. This will likely decrease the cost of the trip by almost half.
