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2. WSSHE Scholarships;

Mac McKenzie Scholarship Fund

 - CMS Requirements for electrical power strips, Phil Kercher provided a very brief but informative presentation on the two CMS/DOH/TJC-approved UL-rated <u>specific</u> power strips for Patient and Non-patient Care areas..
 - A sample of a 4 in 1 duplex receptacle from Leviton and Hubbell that replaces a duplex outlet and converts it to a 4-outlet receptacle. If only two more outlets are needed, this is a slightly cheaper option to avoid a power strip.

5. **Education Session – How digital and integrated is your Hospital?

Brent Tracy of McKinstry hosted a round table discussion on Building Controls and Integration along with Matt Landoe of ATS and Dewight West of Siemens.

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Panel members explained and answered questions as it relates to the following:

- Approaches to BAS Integration
- Communications protocols, Open vs. proprietary
- Move to Cloud based IT

The Panel explained the role of Building Controls in Smart Grid applications such as;

- Demand Response
- System Fault Detection
- Metering Applications
- Utilizing integrated platforms to monitor hospital critical environments
- How does this apply to Healthcare Buildings

Building tour;

The Spokane & Inland Empire Railroad (SIERR Building) at McKinstry Station, built in 1907, was formerly a repair depot for the city's first electric railway system. Designated a national, historic landmark in 2010, through McKinstry's efforts, the SIERR Building survives as the largest, most intact example of an electric streetcar facility from its era. McKinstry converted this turn-of-the-century building into our innovative, energy efficient Regional Inland Northwest headquarters, complete with green office space and retail tenants. The SIERR Building features energy efficiency systems including ground-source heat pumps, radiant panels and a rainwater harvesting system. Building envelope improvements were also performed to increase the energy savings. In the facility's data center, waste heat is recovered from the servers and distributed during cold seasons to serve perimeter heating needs and to reduce overall heating requirements. The server room is set up in a hot/cold aisle configuration which allows for warmer supply air temperatures to be delivered to the servers. This evaporative cooling method was used for the server room and requires no mechanical cooling. The newly refurbished facility is one of a handful of LEED® Gold-certified and high performing historical buildings in the United States.
