

Beatrice Potter (1866-1943) English author and illustrator of children's literature and famous for her beloved Peter Rabbit stories. She was also a natural scientist and conservationist. Played by **Carol Saueressig**

Betty Freidan (1921-2006) Writer, women's activist who wrote The Feminine Mystique and co-founded the National Organization for Women. (NOW) Played by **Liz Helgerson**

Eugenie Clark (1922-) Research oceanography scientist and director of the Mote Marine Laboratory in Florida. She became known as the "Shark Lady." Played by **Susan Miller**

Amelia Earhart (1897-1937) made her first solo Atlantic flight as a pilot in 1932 and disappeared attempting a solo trans-Pacific flight in 1937. Played by **Kaye Rasband**
Thursday, March 5, 11 AM

Sonia Sotomayor (1954 -) 11th Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, First Hispanic Supreme Court Justice and only the third woman to serve and is one of three female current justices. She was sworn in by President Obama in 2009. Played by **Janet Morales**

Mary McLeod Bethune (1875-1955) Equal parts educator, politician, and social visionary, she was one of the most prominent African American women of the 20th century, know as the "First Lady of the Struggle." Played by **Donna Davis**

Women of Color in the work Force during WWII (1941-1945) "Rosie the Riveter" was a famous face during WWII as women took the places of men in the work force. Women of color did their part too, working in factories building war planes and supplies for the fighting men at the front lines. Played by **Lee Perkins**

Joy Adamson (1910-1980) Naturalist and wildlife preservationist who lived in Kenya for over 40 years studying animal behaviors and adopted the famous lion, Elsa, whose life she shadowed and detailed in the book, Born Free. Played by **Martha Pederson**

Women Police Officers - In 1845, New York hired two women to work in the city jails to protect incarcerated women, and police widows were often hired to assist with cases involving women and children. Not until 1910 was a female, Alice Stebbins, licensed to carry a weapon and be labeled a "police officer." Played by **Corporal Michelle Schamber of the Atascadero Police Department**

Madame CJ Walker (1867-1919) The first black self-made female millionaire who sold women hair products and donated much of her fortune to schools and charities. Played by **Penni Monroe**

Margaret Bourke-White (1904-1971) Photojournalist who also studied engineering, biology, and herpetology and was a major contributor for LIFE Magazine and war correspondent, especially relating to the Nazi death camps. Played by **Deborah Cash**

Women Firefighters - From the first female firefighter, Molly Williams, a slave in New York City in 1815 to the first African American Police chief in East Point Georgia, women have been capable, active and accomplished in firefighting for much of our history.
