Project Management Training for Community Development

(Equivalent to Project Management Foundations)

The Project Management Training for Community Development course provides an overview of the essentials to project management. Outcomes of the course include: being able to define projects and the role of the project manager, defining and describing common project management terminology, understanding the Project Management Process Groups and how they are affected by organizational culture, and employing leadership techniques to assure project success. The course material has been tailored to fit the needs of community development professionals. This course provides 16 Project Management Institute PDU's and meets 16 of the 35 contact hours required on the PMP application.
