From the Pastor

Dear Friends:

In a recent article Christina Century, John Buchanan, reminded me of a prolific and profound Presbyterian writer, Frederick Buechner. He spoke of his book, Secrets of the Dark, where Buechner wrote: "Jesus made his church out of human beings with more or less the same mixture in them of cowardice and guts, intelligence and stupidity, of selfishness and generosity, of openness of heart and sheer cussedness as you would be apt to find in any one of us. The reason he made his church out of human beings is that human beings were all there was to make it out of. In fact, as far as I know, human beings are all there is to make it out of still. It's a point worth remembering."

Later in that chapter, Buechner wonders aloud if the best thing that could happen to the church is have a great tidal wave wash it away. "Then all we would have left would be each other and Christ, which was all there was in the first place."

That is a reminder to me of what the church is about – people in relationship. Sometimes we forget that and get lost in the physical pieces of it or let the liturgy become what is more important or allow our personal wishes to supersede what we were created to be. Sometimes I think we lose our way in the church because we unintentionally play a game with a winner (us) and a loser (them).

The reality is we're broken – just like everyone else. We're no better and no worse than those seating to our left, our right, in front, or behind. All of us are just trying to be as faithful to our Lord as we can be, even in the moments of our hiccups. And though we will stumble, fall, curse, scream, and more; in the midst of it all, we are loved – God still loves us!


Maybe the easiest way for us to see ourselves is as "a work in progress." We're trying to be the best we can in life and give our best to our Lord's church. The two go hand-in-hand. What we need to do is work on life and work in the church. If we would commit to giving one hour a month to the church beyond what we normally do, I think it would make us better disciples of our Lord and make PPC a stronger church.

Think about it! Ask what needs to be done in the church! Use your talents and gifts in a way that makes the mission and ministry of PPC truly glorify and honor God! You might be surprised at how much fun it can be and how much can be accomplished!

Lent Schedule

Ash Wednesday - The season of Lent in 2015 starts on Wednesday, February 18 – Ash Wednesday. As is our tradition, we will be holding an Ash Wednesday Service at 7:00 p.m. The service will include the imposition of ashes, symbolizing both purification (Hebrews 9:13) and penitence (Matthew 11:21).



Lenten Services - On the Wednesdays following Ash Wednesday (2/25, 3/4, 3/11, 3/18, and 3/25), we will be holding our Midweek Lenten Services in the Fireside Room at 6:45 p.m. This half hour service is a time of reflection, remembrance, recognition,\ and prayer, as we walk together through the weeks leading up to our Lord's crucifixion.

Lenten Meals - Throughout Lent, the Fellowship/Connection & Membership Team will be making available a light meal starting at 6:00 p.m. This will begin on Ash Wednesday and continue through the last Midweek Lenten Service (March 25). Meals will begin promptly at 6:00 p.m. so we can eat and clean-up before the worship service at 6:45 p.m. A small donation to cover the cost of preparing the meal would be deeply appreciated.

<u>Safety First!</u> Please follow these guidelines regarding WPS preschool children and the church driveway



The WPS preschool has been operating at PPC for nearly 5 months now. The safety of the children is of great importance to both WPS & PPC. There are several policies in place to insure we have

a safe environment. One policy in particular addresses the traffic at the church around the times of student drop off (6:30-9:30 a.m.) and pickup (3:15-6:15 p.m.), Monday – Friday when school is in session. Parents and staff are directed to park in the lot and walk their students to/from the main entrance during these times.

We ask that PPC members also follow this policy. Following this policy will greatly reduce the chance of an accident. If you need to drop off items at the church door, please plan around the drop off/pick up times whenever possible. If you are assisting handicapped or elderly to the doors during those times, please exercise extreme caution.
