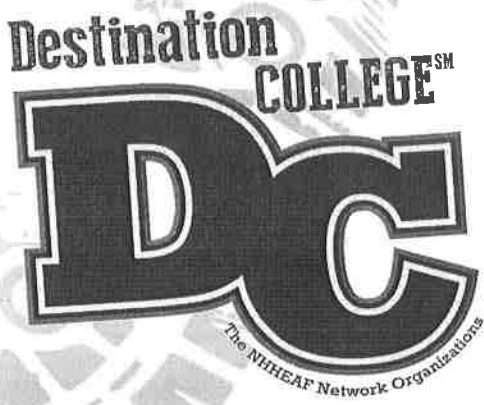

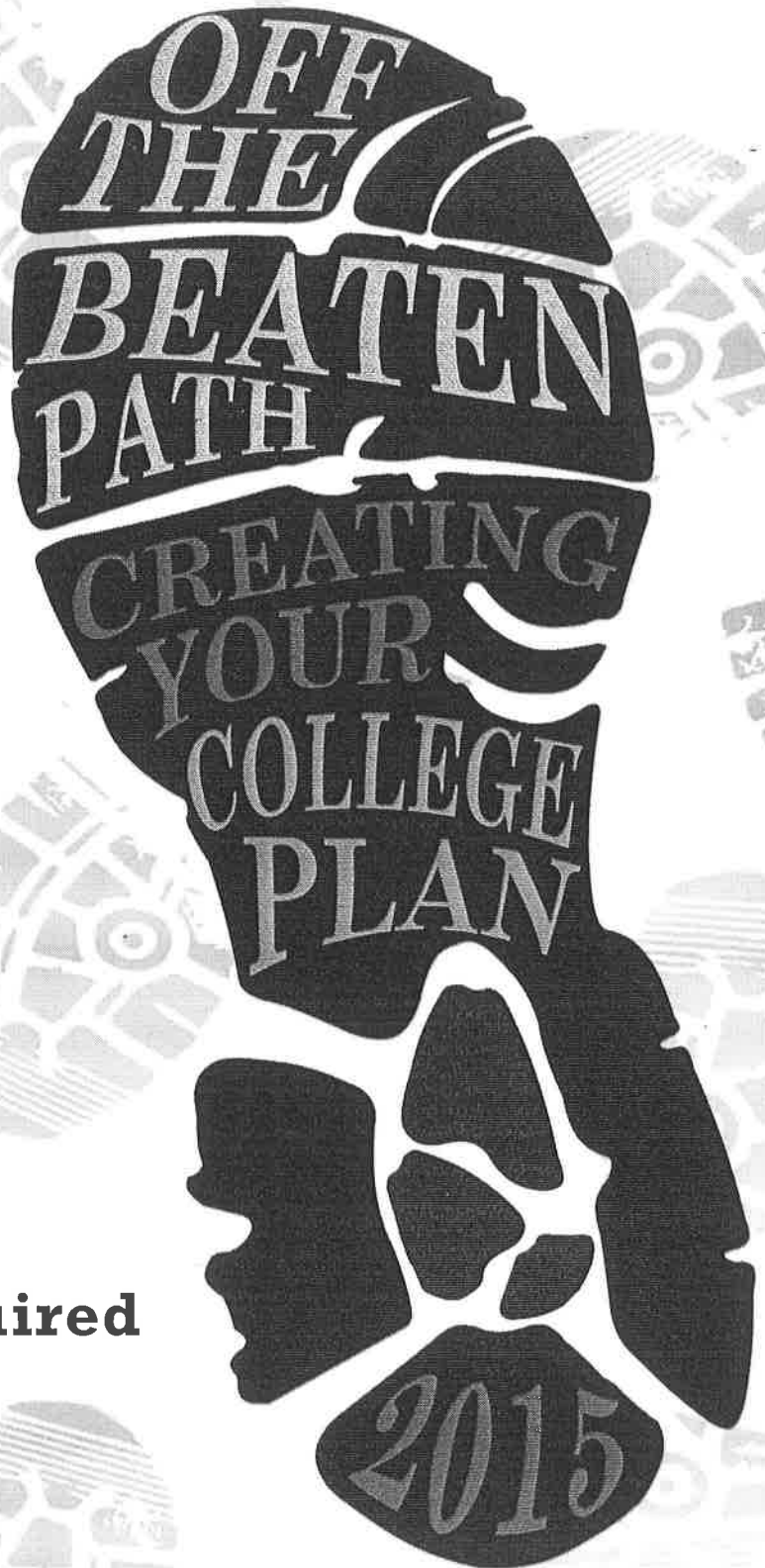

“Family-to-Family” is an educational program that is **FREE** for family members, partners and friends of individuals over the age of 17, who have a mental illness such as: Anxiety, Schizophrenia, Bipolar Disorder, Depression, Borderline Personality Disorder, Panic Disorder and Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD), or Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

- ? Is there someone in your life that has one of these illnesses?**
- ? Have you been struggling to understand their illness and how to help them and your family to cope?**

The “Family-to-Family” course is taught by local trained volunteers who have family members with a mental illness. In this course you will learn about these illnesses and their treatments; how to improve communication with your loved one; solve problems; find the help you need; and take care of yourself.

Your Next Steps

1. Continue to apply to additional schools if needed. Remember – make sure your list is balanced based on your eligibility for admission. For example, you could use the 2-2-2 approach and have two “reach” schools, two “target” schools, two “probable” schools. Just make sure that at least one is a “financial safety” school!
2. Make sure to send any missing application components, including essays, SAT/ACT scores, letters of recommendations, transcripts, payment or fee waiver information to each school to which you have applied. Ask your school counselor for help!
3. This fall, attend your school's Financial Aid Night presentation with your parent(s) or guardian(s). This helpful workshop will help you understand the financial aid process.
4. As soon after January 1 as possible, file the 2015-2016 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov to be eligible for federal and institutional federal student aid. Your school may even hold a FAFSA filing day. If not, call the Center for College Planning at 888.7.GRADUATE, x119 for free help filing the application. Also check to see if any of the schools you've applied to require the CSS/PROFILE® form. Remember to meet all deadlines for financial aid to maximize any possible aid.
5. Start looking for scholarships! Check with your school's guidance office for a list of local scholarships. Visit www.nh93.com for more local and regional scholarships. The NH Charitable Foundation's (www.nhcf.org) Statewide Student Aid Program is due mid-April. Most scholarships will have deadlines prior to May 1, 2015.
6. In March and April, review the financial aid award letters you receive from the schools to which you've been accepted. If necessary, update your FAFSA as requested by the school or Federal Student Aid.
7. In April, attend an “Understanding The Award Letter” presentation at your school. Meet with your school counselor or the Center for College Planning to review your financial aid award letters and to help make your decision on where you will go to school by May 1, the National Candidate Reply Date.
